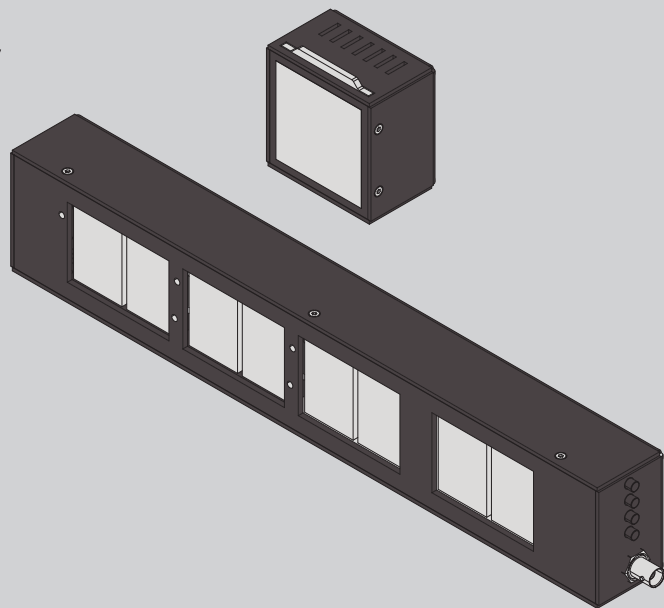

About this Guide

This manual provides essential instructions for the installation, configuration, and operation of the product. To ensure correct and efficient use, read the manual in full before starting any procedures, as certain information applicable to multiple sections is provided only once.

This product is intended for use in industrial and broadcast environments.

Clock Unit Overview

The Clock can operate as a standalone unit. It receives power directly from PSP or PSP+ monitors via an RJ45 connection to the AUX IN port on the Clock.

The Clock displays studio time and camera number using high-visibility seven-segment LED characters. All LEDs support both red and green output. Brightness is calibrated for consistency across all segments, individual LEDs, and both colours.

Tally Unit Overview

The Tally is a simple indicator unit that receives both power and Tally state over a bus connection. Power can be supplied from a PSP or PSP+ monitor, a PSU, or via a connected Clock unit.

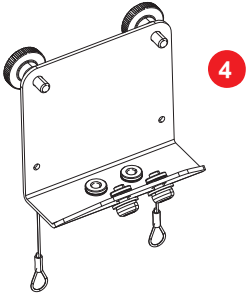
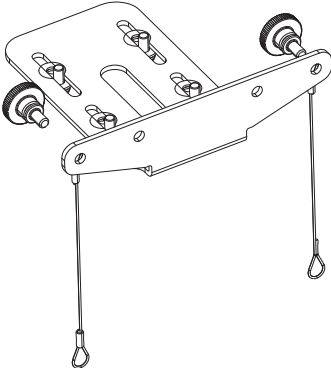
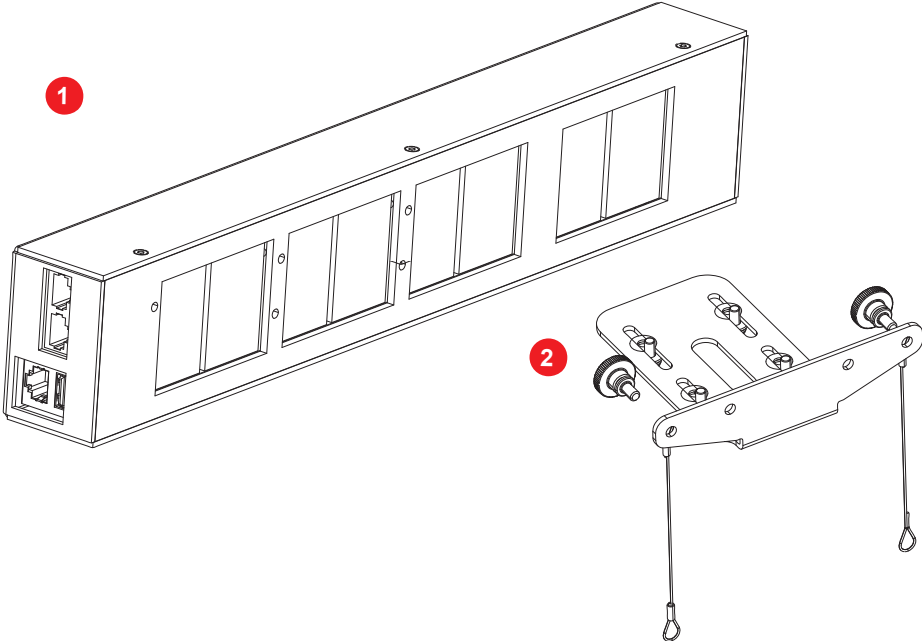
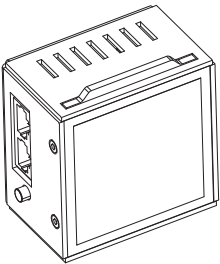
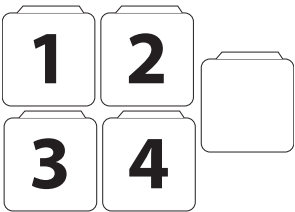
The Tally state is received through a standard opto-isolated sensor. The unit displays a 'live' camera status using a square, diffused, high-brightness red LED.

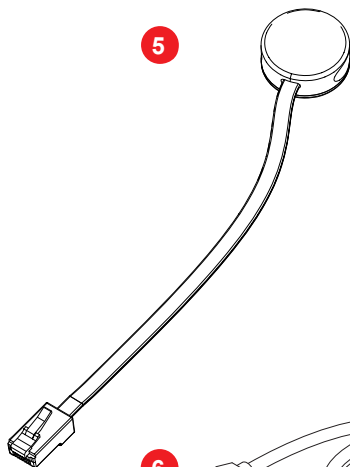
An optional green off-air mode allows the Tally number to remain visible when the camera is not live.

A 3 mm momentary push button allows users to cycle through five pre-set brightness levels. Additionally, the brightness can be automatically synchronized with the connected Clock unit.

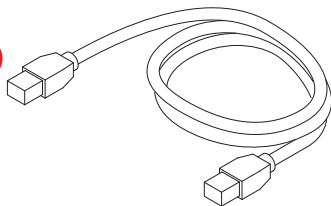

Mounting Instructions

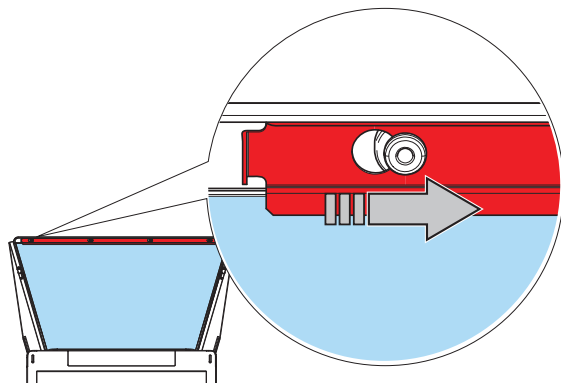
The following cautions must be observed without fail during mounting of the product. Otherwise, the product may be damaged or even destroyed. The warranty does not cover damage resulting from failure to observe the following instructions:

Tally

The mounting points for the Tally are located on the hood under the glazing bar.

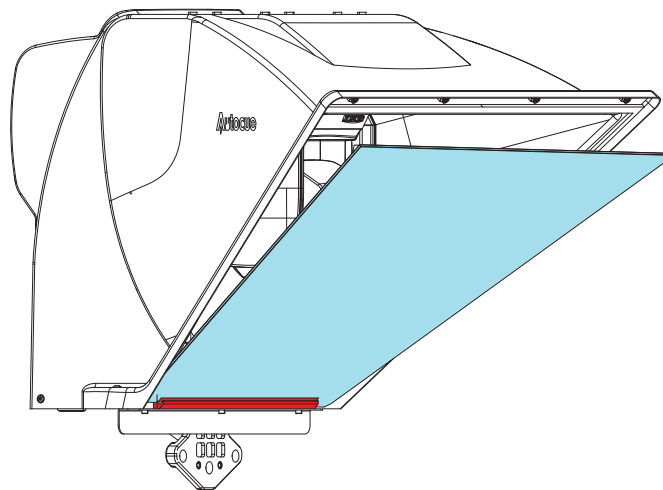
If the glass is fitted remove as follows.

1. Release the top glazing bar by sliding the bar to the right (when facing from the front) until the key way aligns with the bobbins and remove the bar from the hood.



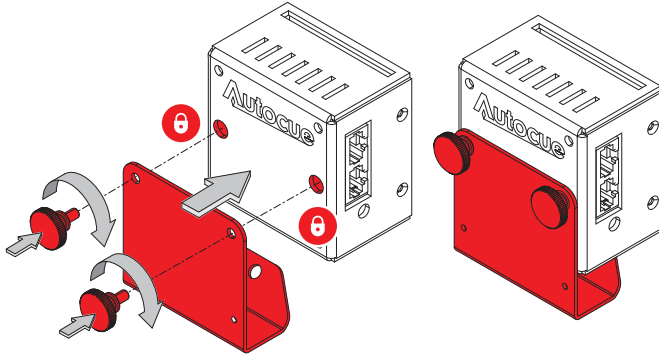
WARNING! Handle the glass with care. Recommend slip resistance gloves for safe handling. Store the glass carefully on a flat surface.

2. Carefully lift out the glass

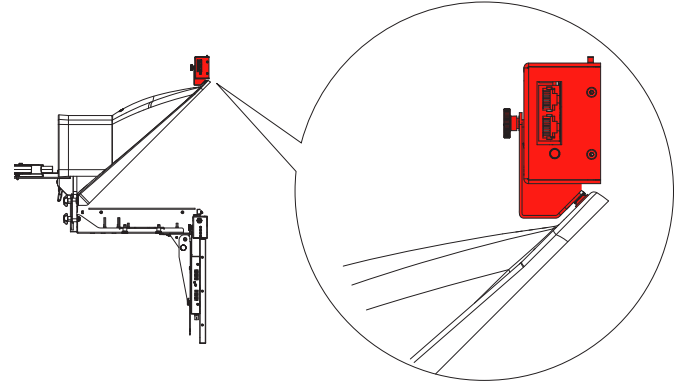
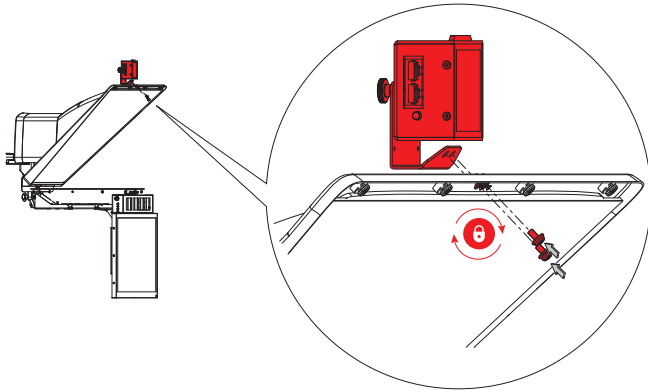


3. Put the glass somewhere safe on a flat surface.
4. When the Tally is fitted replace the glass and glazing bar by reversing steps 1 and 2.

5. Attach the Tally to the Tally Mounting Bracket using the 2 x thumbscrews.



6. Secure the Tally and Mounting Bracket to the hood by inserting the screws from below the hood and screwing into the Tally Mounting Bracket.

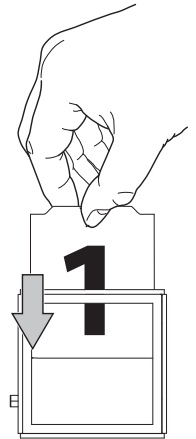


7. Refit the glass (follow step 4).

To fit the Tally Discs

Slide the numbered disc into the slot in the top of the Tally to display the desired camera number.

Note! A blanc disc is also supplied allowing the use of a marker pen to create a unique identifier.

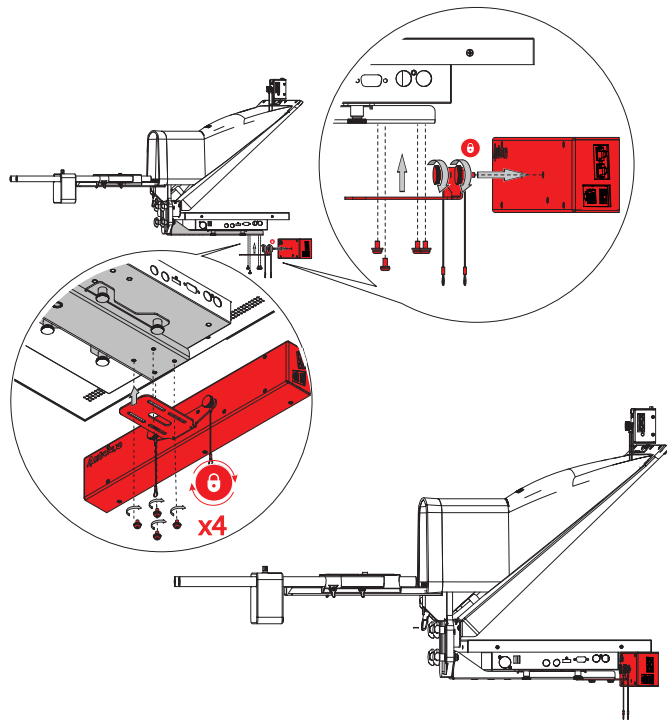

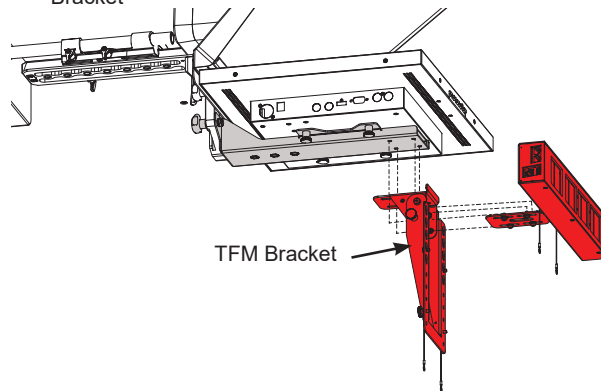
To fit the Clock when there is no talent monitor in use.

1. Use the 2 x thumbscrews to secure the Clock Mounting Bracket to the Clock.
2. Use the 4 x M4 screws to attach the Clock to the Monitor Rail Bracket.

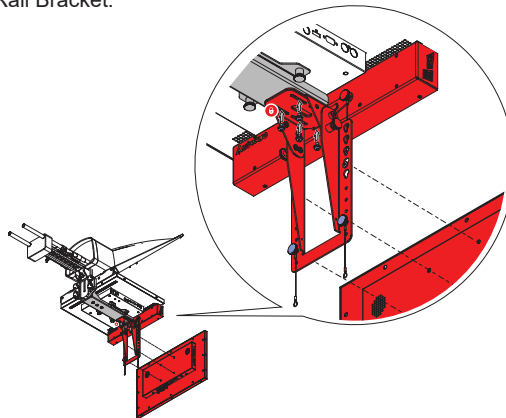


To fit the Clock when there is a talent monitor in use.

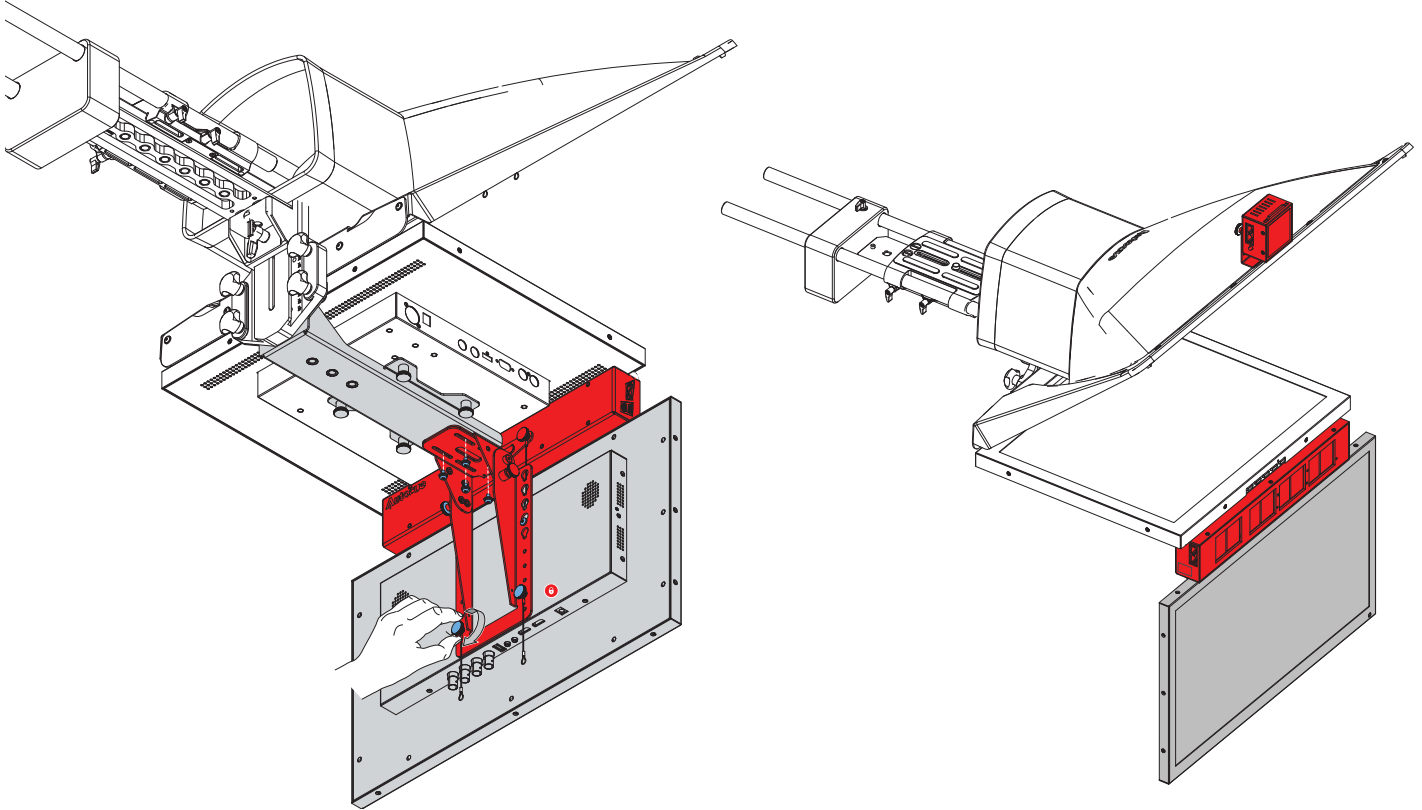
1. Slide the Clock Mounting B racket into the TFM Mounting Bracket



2. Use the 4 x M4 screws to secure the 2 x brackets to the Monitor Rail Bracket.



3. Attach the monitor to the TFM Bracket below the Tally and tighten the 2 x thumbscrews to secure.

CAUTION! Equipment Damage

When mounting the product, be sure to allow adequate air circulation for cooling. The ventilation holes must not be obstructed. The ambient conditions stated in the "Technical Specifications" chapter must be ensured at all times.

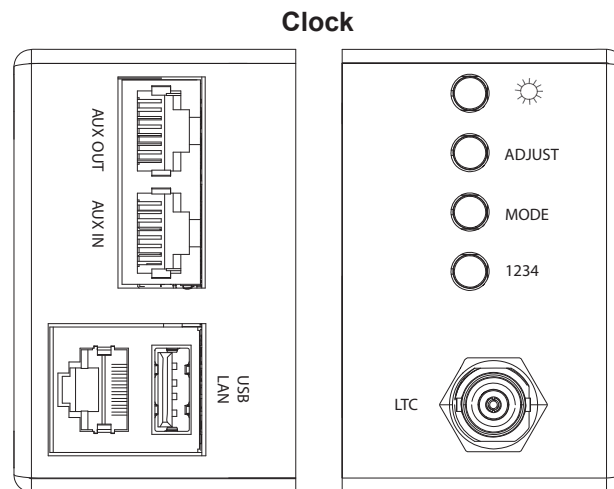
The product must not be twisted during mounting. Use the intended mounting points.

LAN	1 x RJ45
USB	1 x USB-A
AUX	IN 1 x RJ45 (Power Input)
AUX OUT	1 x RJ45 (Power Output)
LTC	1 x BNC

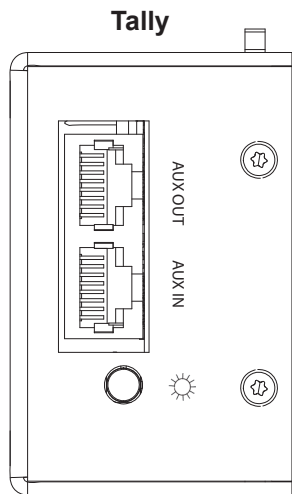
1. Isolate the system and the product from power.
2. Connect the LTC cable to the system's signal output (if present) and to the LTC signal input of the product.
3. Connect AUX IN of the Tally (if present) or the LDR sensor (if present) to the AUX OUT of the Clock.
4. Connect network to LAN.

Note! Incorrect cable connections may impair the proper functioning of the product.

- Attach the power supply into the AUX IN.

Only use specified power source:

DC: 12V +/-5%, safety extra-low voltage (SELV)



AUX IN..... 1 x RJ45 (Power Input)
AUX OUT..... 1 x RJ45 (Power Output)

- Isolate the system and the product from power.
- Connect the AUX OUT of the Tally to the LDR sensor or an additional Tally.

Note! Incorrect cable connections may impair the proper functioning of the product.

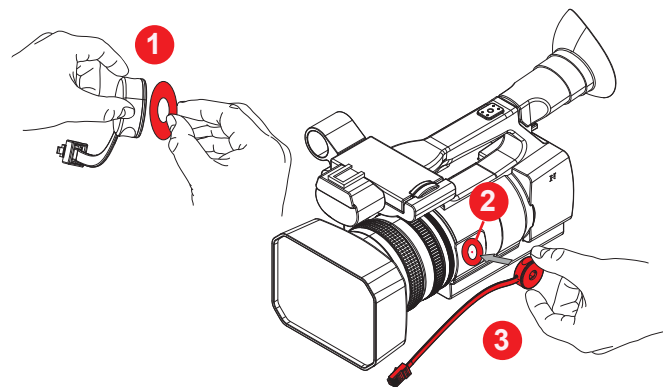
- Attach the power supply into the AUX IN.
- Only use specified power source:
DC: 12V +/-5%, safety extra-low voltage (SELV)!

Tally Sensor

Fitting the Tally Sensor to the Camera

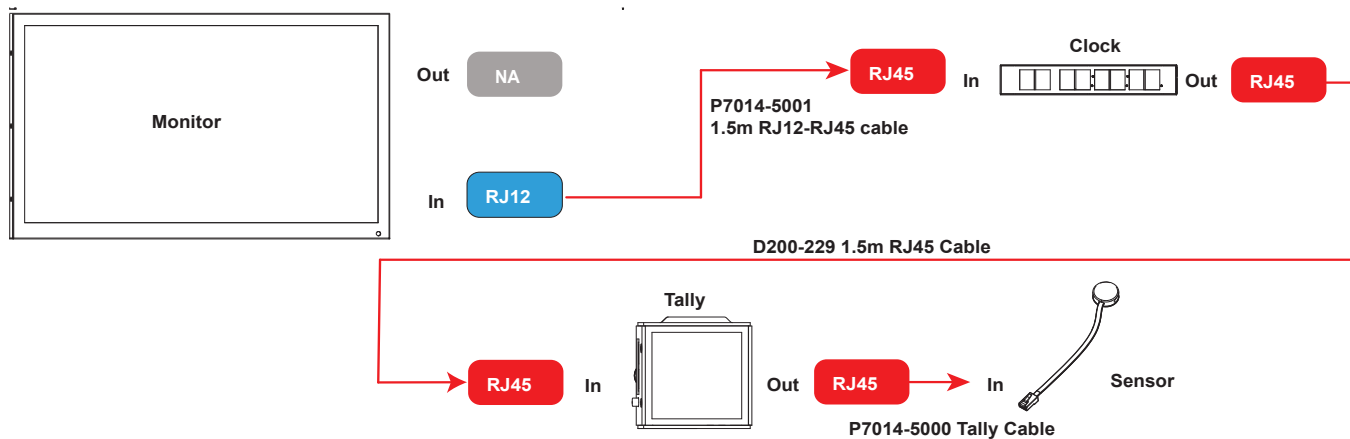
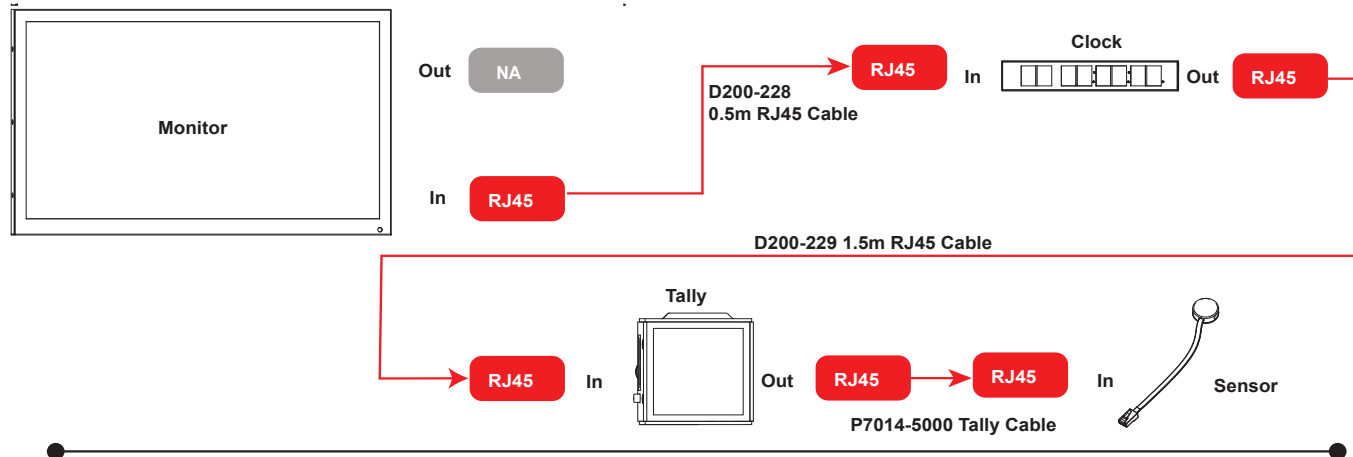
- Peel the Velcro circle from the back of the Tally Sensor.
- Affix the Velcro circle around the camera's Tally light.
- Press the Tally Sensor onto the Velcro attached to the camera.

Once fitted, the sensor will detect when the camera's Tally light is illuminated and will activate the red Tally display accordingly.



Set-up

Connection Sequence: Monitor > Clock > Tally > Tally sensor



OSD Controls Clock

	Scroll through six levels of brightness for visual indicators.
Adjust	Select LEDs for adjustment RTC: Push ADJUST to increment value on selected segments. Push MODE to decrement value on selected segments. Push 12/24 to select next segments. Push to save settings.
Mode	Switch between RTC, LTC, NTP
12/24	Switch between 12 and 24 hour format (Press 2 seconds to show IP).

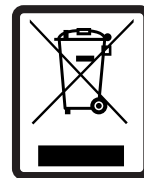
